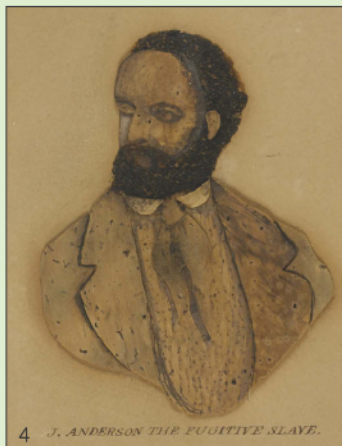
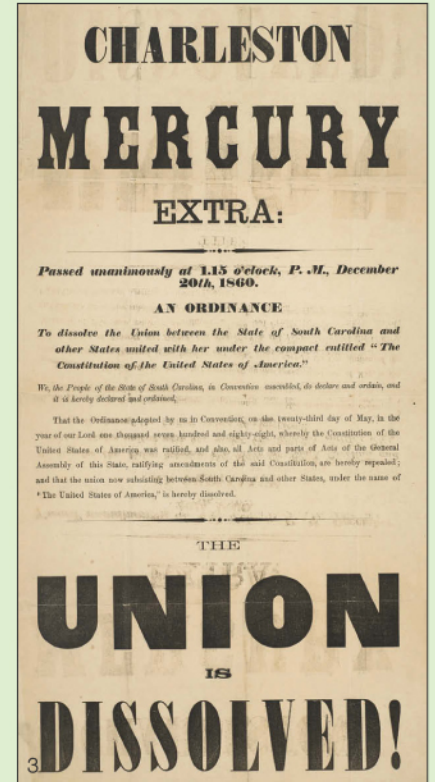

**W**E, the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common Defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to Ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

**ARTICLE I.**  
SECT. 1. ALL legislative powers herein granted, shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.  
SECT. 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year

**PEACE! LIBERTY! and INDEPENDENCE!**  
PHILADELPHIA March 24, 1783.  
**Y**ESTERDAY arrived, after a passage of 32 days from Cadiz, a French sloop of war commanded by M. de Quesne, with the agreeable intelligence of PEACE. The particular Articles respecting this happy and glorious Event are as follows. The principle articles of the preliminaries of the Peace of the 20th January, 1783.  
FRANCE to retain Tobago and Senegal.  
FRANCE to restore to GREAT-BRITAIN Grenada, St. Vincents, Dominico and St. Christophers.  
6 St. Eustatia, Demarara, Barbice and Iliquibo to be restored to the Dutch.

**G. WASHINGTON.**  
Major GEORGE WASHINGTON's Journal to the River OHIO, &c.  
Wednesday, October 31st, 1753.  
**I** WAS commissioned and appointed by the Honourable Robert Dinwiddie, Esq; Governor, &c. of Virginia, to visit and deliver a Letter to the Commandant of the French Forces on the Ohio, and set out on the intended Journey the same Day; the next, I arrived at Frederickburg, and engaged Mr. Jacob Van Braam, to be my French Interpreter; and proceeded with him to Alexandria, where we provided Necessaries; from thence we went to Winchester, got baggage, Horses, &c. and from thence
