




John Tyler, Autograph Letter Signed, to his son, describing the "exchequer system," circa 1858. Estimate \$6,000 to \$9,000.




Etched portrait of Albert Einstein by Hermann Struck, signed by Einstein and the artist, 1931. Estimate \$3,500 to \$5,000.
