





Jeffrey Roelof specializes in Americana and folk art with original painted surfaces. He currently exhibits at the Nashville Show in Nashville, Tenn., and The Midwest Antiques Show in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

In the 1980s Jeffrey began going to flea markets, shops and auctions with his grandfather and his mother. He became interested in antique toys, especially Popeye and other comic characters. Over time his interest has evolved from antique toys into a passion for folk art and Americana.

Jeffrey has worked for 30 years in the pharmaceutical industry. His other interests include fly fishing, traveling with his family and

attending his two teenage daughters' many theatrical productions.

Bruce Emond — Village Braider



Born in Quincy, Mass. I bought my first antique at age 12, a Seventeenth Century English coffer which I still have. After high school I went on to Boston Museum School where I graduated from the fifth-year program and Tufts University. I went to Skowhegan summer school on a full scholarship from Museum School. There I had teachers that greatly influenced me, namely Buckminster Fuller, Robert Mangold, Philip Pearlstein and Roy Lichtenstein, to name a few. I worked for the Appalachian Mountain Club in the 1970s and have always had a great love of the White Mountains.

I got involved in the family antique business, Village Braider, in 1981, which my mother, Anna Emond, started in 1965. She worked in the trade until she was 90. Starting at the bottom with Saint Stanislaus Hall in Nashua and Dick and Ellie's flea market on Cape Cod, and of course Brimfield, moving on to the Pier shows, Armory shows, all of the Wilton shows and Rhinebeck for more than 25 years.

Village Braider is currently exhibiting at the Washington Winter Antique Show, Nashville Antiques and Garden Show, New York Botanical Garden Show, Easthampton Antiques Show, Newport Antiques Show, Manchester Collectors Fair and Greenwich Winter Antiques Show. I've always been an eclectic dealer with a broad range in interesting art, antiques and garden antiques and folk art.

John Sideli

When I was still in high school I became friends with a college classmate of my older brother. His name was John Wood. He lived in Newtown, Conn., in a house that was built in 1692. It was through this friendship that I was seriously drawn into the world of antiques and early new England architecture. One of the very special pieces that his family owned was a Sunflower Chest. It was a pretty captivating enough so that it inspired me to pur-






Initially, he bought and sold early Nineteenth Century painted furniture. Then he made a trek to Exeter, N.H., stopped to see Roger








