> History in this auction is rich in Texas lore with signed first or limited-edition copies of Haley's (1976) "Rough Time - Tough Fiber," Combs' (1968) "Gunsmoke in the Redlands," and Hinkle's (1966) "Early Days of a Cowboy on the Pecos." For students of WWII, there is a framed copy of April 1945 "Special Map Showing Contact Between Gen. Hodges First U.S. Army and Gen. Jadov's Fifth U.S.S.R. Army 25 April 1945." And we would be remiss if we did not mention that we will sell a small (approx. 5" x 7.5") but important item of Confederate history - namely (1865) "An Act to provide the appointment of [Robert E. Lee] a General in Chief of the Armies of the Confederate States." This last item is rarely found given its small printing and the cheapness of the paper on which it was printed.
